MAIN ESTABLISHMENT REGIME


Where decisions related to the cybersecurity riskmanagement measures are predominantly taken

Where establishment with the highest number of employees in the EU is located






DOMAIN NAME REGISTRIES AND REGISTRARS

> Use existing resources




• Example Telecom providers


- Telecom providers are subject to general authorisation
